Conservation writer Jerry Emory (MA '85 Geography) will recount the origins of scientific management of wildlife in the U.S. national parks through the history of George Meléndez Wright (B.S. 1927 Forestry), who, at the age of 25, led the first scientific survey of wildlife across the western U.S. national parks. Alison Forrestel (PhD '13 Environmental Science, Policy, and Management), Chief of Natural Resources and Science for Golden Gate National Recreation Area, will illustrate innovations in science for natural and cultural resource management in U.S. national parks today.
